# MULTICULTURALISM, FOOD, AND RELIGIONS IN THE ITALIAN-FRENCH RIVIERA 1-Week / 3-Credit Field Learning Program

## **About the Program**

The **LSSOIF280** 1-week / 3-credit field learning course engages the student in the exploration of the history and culture of the French and Italian Riviera, a region that still today preserves a peculiar identity, and builds a bridge between the Mediterranean and Northern Europe. The program content includes lectures, visits to historic and contemporary sites, tastes of local gastronomy, expanded cultural horizons, and contact with local culture, which will directly strengthen and challenge perspectives of the areas examined.

### **Available Sessions**

The program is offered once a year in the Summer academic season.

## SUMMER Session D

The program start and end days are Sun-Sun. The course can be combined with the Summer Session II 3-Week Session (4-Week Session VI).

## **Additional Program Option**

The **LSSOIF280** field learning week can be taken alone for 3 credits, combined with courses in Summer Session II, or as a 6-credit course as described by the following option:

### LSSOIF340 (1-Week + Florence)

6 semester credits / 9 quarter credits

Students who are interested in the 1-week field learning course and wish to continue with the Riviera topic may enroll in the 6-credit LSSOIF340 option. The course begins with the field learning week and continues in Florence throughout the 3-week Summer II Session.
